Paul states that he was once a child, talked like a child, thought like a child and reasoned like a child. But God's Spirit moved him to mature as God's child and steward. This same miraculous change is taking place in our lives as we give evidence through words and actions that we are blessed to be blessings to others.

Excel in the Grace of Giving: Last Sunday, the message in our stewardship program “Excel in the Grace of Giving” focused on “Overcoming Greed.” Today our theme is “More Blessed to Give.” God has ordained that we are blessed more through our giving than those who receive our gifts. Jesus said in Acts 20:34, *“It is more blessed to give than to receive.”* The Lord promises that as we give we will be blessed and refreshed so we can continue to give. *“You will be made rich in every way so that you can be generous on every occasion, and through us your generosity will result in thanksgiving to God”* (2 Corinthians 9:11). Please join us next week as we continue our series, “Excel in the Grace of Giving.”

Today in Sunday School: Through many miracles, Jesus shows us His power over sin. Ask your children to tell you who Jesus healed. What were some of the sicknesses the people had? Talk about sin—yours, theirs, the world’s and how Satan holds the world in bondage, causing sickness and death. Assure them that Jesus is the Holy One of God, who defeats Satan and frees us from his hold, granting us eternal life in paradise. Emphasize that Jesus has power over sin and sickness, saving the lost by His death and resurrection.
