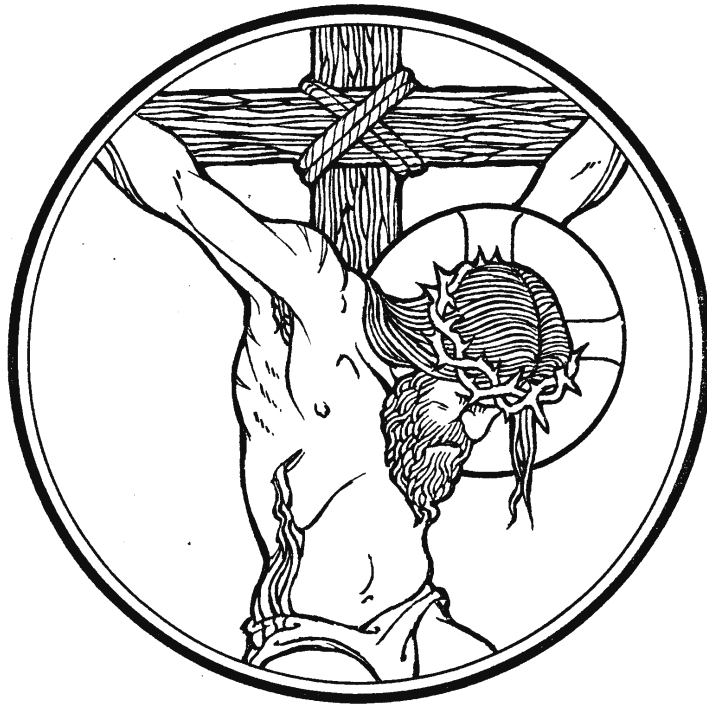

The services from the evening of Maundy Thursday to Easter Sunday form one continuous liturgy historically known as the "Triduum" (the "three days"). Therefore, just as we had no benediction on Maundy Thursday to end the service, our Good Friday worship has no entrance rite nor benediction.
