Church Worker Training Assistance Program (CTAP)

August recalls the startup of schools. Did you know that the ND District offers monetary assistance to LCMS member students who are planning a career in church work and are attending a Concordia college or seminary? This year the District has eight students receiving aid. To receive aid, students must sign an agreement to pay back any funds if they do not stay in LCMS ministry. After the student graduates, each year they work in LCMS ministry is equal to one year of forgiven loan funds. The district is happy to financially support such service. Our ND LWML donates much of their Mite money to help our students. Churches and individuals donate also.

Career plans sometimes change and that is no different for these students. When that happens, the student has an obligation to pay back the funds. When this promise is broken, it is frustrating and not fair to those who do uphold the conditions of the signed agreement. It also leaves less funds to help other students pursuing church work.
