Give your servant therefore an understanding mind to govern your people, that I may discern between good and evil, for who is able to govern this your great people?"

It pleased the Lord that Solomon had asked this. And if you will walk in my ways, keeping my statutes and my commandments, as your father David walked, then I will lengthen your days."

Here is a brief summary of the retreat: "We've all preached the wedding at Cana, but because there is just so much going on, and it is in the season of Epiphany, we fail to substantially tug at this thread, probably, because our homiletical time for Lent has not yet come. The phrase "my hour" or "his hour" (ὥρα) is used in this pregnant sense many more times before it reaches its end in the discourse in John chapter twelve.
